English

Our English work centres around a book by Neil Gaiman called

Cinnamon which is about a young girl in India with pearls for eyes. Our work over the term will lead to us writing a narrative. Our new class novel is 'Podkin one-ear'.



Maths

Our focus this term is on decimals. As we are moving towards the later part of the year, we will also be mixing in quite a bit of revision into our maths lessons too in order to ensure the children are retaining as much as possible from the Year 4 curriculum.



Science



We will be finishing our 'Animals including Humans' which involves learning about food chains and webs. After this, we will be completing some learning about animal classification.

Geography

Our focus in Geography this term is 'What is life like in the Alps?'. The unit will focus on identifying the location of the Alps and what countries it spreads through. A closer look will be on the human and physical characteristics of the Alps whilst we will also be looking at what life is like there and comparing it to our local area.



Computing

Our focus this term will be working on Artificial Intelligence which is all around us and in the news on an almost daily basis. This unit introduces children to the concept of artificial intelligence, focuses on how it is used in our lives, looks at the future of AI and finally, considers the role of Artificial Intelligence in creativity.

Art

In art this term we will be investigating how fabric ad wallpaper designers use nature as an influence, creating our own designs and developing repeating patterns.

We will look closely at the work of William Morris for inspiration.



RE

This term, we will be learning about another part of the Jewish faith and asking 'What is the best way for a Jewish person to show a commitment to God?'



PE

This term, Dolphins will be continuing to swim whilst still having one PE lesson in school. Stingrays and Turtles will be

completing lessons in both cricket and athletics this term, hoping to get outside as much as possible.



PSHE

Our topic this term is Friendship. We will be discussing the ideas behind friendship and how friends make us

feel whilst recognising the features that make people 'good friends'.
