English

This term, we will be reading 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon. It will give us opportunities to sequence a story, look at inference skillsI and we will be finishing off by learning how to write a letter, using adjectives and interesting vocabulary to keep our readers engaged.

Maths


At the beginning of this

term, we will be learning about addition and subtraction. We will build upon our prior knowledge of place value and partitioning to recognise fact families. We will also build on our knowledge of tens and ones to use the column method to add and subtract two-digit numbers. Towards the end of the term, we will then move on to shape and will look at 2D and 3D shape names and the properties that they have.

Science

In Science this term, we will be exploring the topic 'Animals including humans'. We will look at different lifecycles, for example the life cycle of a frog and the life cycle of a human. We will also be describing the importance of exercise for humans, as well as what foods are the right foods for a healthy diet and how to keep ourselves clean.





Geography

This term, we will be continuing to answer our critical question 'Why is our world wonderful?'. We will learn to Identify and locate characteristics of the UK on a map. Identify and locate human and physical features on a world map. Explain the difference between oceans and seas. Name and locate the five oceans on a world



Computing

In computing this term, we will begin by reminding ourselves how to stay safe when using the internet. Our main focus this term will be coding. We will explore some software and work out how we can use codes to create animations, games and instructions on the computer. As well as looking at how to debug a programme.

$\mathcal{D}T$

This term, we will be making a chair that is suitable for a teddy to sit on. The children need to consider how to make a model strong, stiff and stable. They will identify man-made and natural structures as well as stable and unstable structural shapes.



RE

In RE this term, we will begin by looking at Christianity. We will focus on the concept of the importance of Christmas for Christians. We will think

about the importance of Jesus in Christianity and why this is an important time of year around the world.



PŦ

For outdoor PE we will be doing the unit, 'hit, run and catch' where we will be doing lots of games and activities to achieve this. Our Indoor sessions will continue to be Gymnastics. These will

focus on moving in different ways across the room. We will be able to move at different levels and use some apparatus.



PSHE

In PSHE this term, we will be exploring the topic 'Celebrating Difference'. We will be recognising the importance of

diversity in class and talking about how we are all unique in our own way. We will have lots of opportunity for discussion and debates this term.
