# English

In English we will be focusing on some writing skills including possessive apostrophes, tenses and subordinate clauses.

We will be using the text, 'Our Tower' by Joseph Coelho to inspire the children's poetry writing.



#### Maths

This term we will revisit fractions, including looking at unit and nonunit fractions.

We will then revise money including pounds and pence, adding and subtracting with money and finding chanae.

We then focus on time, using digital and analogue clocks, telling the time to the minutes and looking at the durations of hours, minutes and seconds



#### Science

### Animals and humans - healthy eating.

This term will focus all around healthy eating, exploring what our bodies need to stay healthy. We will be exploring The Eat Well Plate, what eating 5-a-day looks like and what makes a balanced diet.



# Geography

Over the next two terms we will be beginning our geography topic! We will be learning all about rivers and coasts and linking this to our curriculum intent: home, near, far!



# Computing

This term we will continue to use Purple Mash. We will look at effective internet searching and then look at what computer simulations are and how they can be imaginary or real.



#### Art

This term we will focus on how to transform 2D card shapes into 3D structures and sculptures. We will explore abstract shapes and space, developing skills in constructing 3D objects, and understanding the difference between 2D and 3D Art.



## RE

This term we will be looking at Sikhism and discussing whether Sikhs think it is important to share.



## PE

This term we will be learning how to play tennis and will take part in athletics activities.

Hedgehogs and Wolves will also be swimming this term.




## PSHE
