English

This half term we will continue to produce writing outcomes based on our topic of World War II. We will be writing a



biography about Adolf Hitler and Ann Frank, in which we research facts about significant events during their lives.




Also this term, we will be looking at 'Windrush Child' by Benjamin Zephaniah in more detail and use this text to compare and contrast political events then and in modern day.

Maths

In maths, our focus this term is on fractions followed by measurement – converting units.

As always, the children will have the opportunity to practice fluency questions as well as tackling reasoning and problem-solving questions.



During this term we will develop our understanding of number and place value in weekly arithmetic sessions.

Science


Light is our topic in science this term. We will be learning about how we see by exploring



how our eyes work and making a detailed collaged diagram. We will be discovering how light travels, how we see colour, what light sources are, how shadows are created, and finding out what refraction means through research and investigations.

History

In history this term, we are continuing with our WW2 topic which sees us learning what happened towards the end of the war and finding out about the holocaust. We will also find out about code-breaking, the enigma machine, the use for propaganda posters during WW2 and Bletchley Park.



Computing

In computing this term, we will provide the children with the opportunity to find out how networks work, understand computer networks including the Internet and explore the opportunities the World Wide Web offers for communication and collaboration. We will also continue to explore internet safety and how to keep ourselves and others safe.



Design Technology

In DT this term, we will be exploring cooking and nutrition – 'Come Dine with Me.'

In this unit, we will be researching and designing a three-course meal in which we will apply culinary skills and knowledge.



RE

This term we will be looking at Christianity and Christmas in particular. We will be exploring the enquiry question:

How significant is it that Mary was Jesus' mother?

In PE this term, we will be learning the jive in our indoor sessions. Outdoor PE will be tag rugby for Zebra and Crocodile class. Elephant class will be swimming on a Wednesday this term too.

As the weather gets colder, please ensure your child has the appropriate kit




PSHE

Home Learning

- Spellings Spelling home learning continues to be set each week on EdShed. In order to complete their spelling home learning and to practice for their spelling test each Friday, we ask that the children complete a minimum of 3 games each week
- Reading To encourage reading for pleasure and to support their progress, we ask that the children read as regularly as possible, ideally daily. Please ensure your child records every time they read in their reading record. Reading records continue to be check on a regular basis in class.
- Maths- Children are to complete the worksheet in their arithmetic CGP book on a weekly basis. The book is to be brought into school each Friday.
