Hello and welcome to your child's first term in Reception! From Week 2 we will be sending out a weekly home learning document with activities for you to complete with your child. This will include an online reading book, an online maths activity and some additional practical tasks that will link to our learning each week.

We follow the Essential Letters and Sounds (ELS) Scheme to teach Phonics in Reception.

We will learn the following Grapheme Phoneme Correspondences (GPC's or sounds):

s at pin m d g o c k ck e u r ss h b f ff l \mathbb{I}

We will learn the following Harder to Read and Spell Words (HRSW):

I, the, no, put, of, is, to, go, into, pull, as, his

It is important that you regularly read with your children, not only to help retain their sound knowledge, but to improve their fluency of reading and their recognition of the Harder to Read and Spell Words (HRSW). As always, please speak to your child's Class Teacher if you have any questions or concerns regarding early reading.





Messages

Reading

You will receive your logins shortly for Oxford Owl which is our primary reading platform, where we set weekly books based on our current phonics teaching. All children will be set the same books to consolidate their phonics learning. Later in the term, the children will bring home a physical, decodable reading book that will be tailored to their reading abilities. We will also send home a book from our class library each week for you to enjoy reading together for pleasure.

Your child will receive a Reading Record for you to record any and all reading that you do with your child each day. This can be them reading to you, or you reading to them. The Reading Record is not exclusive to just books, as you can log reading menus, signs, magazines and road names etc. We will use the Reading Record to log when we have read with your child on a 1:1 basis in school and will make any appropriate comments regarding their reading. Therefore, please can you ensure that your child's Reading Record is in their bookbag every day!

Book change day will be every Monday.

You will receive your logins shortly. We will set a weekly Maths game as part of your child's Home Learning.

Tapestry

Tapestry is an online learning journal that we will use to document your child's learning journey throughout Reception. We will upload one observation per week, per child. This will either have a literacy or maths focus. In addition, we will upload whole class WOW moments. We also upload a weekly 'Our Learning' post where we will explain what our focus will be for literacy and maths that week. We encourage you to upload photos to Tapestry too, as this is a great talking point for your child and helps them to gain confidence in talking in front of others.
