Reception - Term 4

We have had so much fun this term learning all about dinosaurs and space!

We began our dinosaur topic with a visit from Mrs Mollins, the author of '10 Cretaceous Dinosaurs'. We learnt lots of facts throughout the topic and the children wowed us by writing fantastic dinosaur facts. We compiled these together and created a class information book. The children were extremely proud of themselves and have enjoyed referring to themselves as authors!

We then learnt about space, answering the critical question 'I Wonder What is in Space?' We learnt about planets, stars, meteor showers and rockets! We loved visiting Mr G's space dome where we watched the story of Astronaut Ted who wanted to know which planet to plant his flower on. We then enjoyed a fantastic 'Space Day' where we made planets, navigated an obstacle course, made space biscuits and danced to music at a disco!

Next term we will be learning about Fairytales and Life Cycles. We will have some tiny, fluffy visitors arriving towards the end of the term. Can you guess what they are?...

We will also be celebrating World Book Day in March by reading the text 'Change Sings.'

We follow the Essential Letters and Sounds (ELS) Scheme to teach Phonics in Reception.

We have now learnt the following GPC's:

Term 1: s a t p i n m d g o c k ck e u r ss h b f ff l ll Term 2: j v w x y z zz qu ch sh th ng nk ai ee igh oa Term 3: ar ur oo (book) oo (moon) or ow (town) oi ear air ure er ow (snow)

We have learnt the following HRS words:

Term 1: I, the, no, put, of, is, to, go, into, pull, as, his

Term 2: he, she, buses, we, me, be, push, was, her, my, you

Term 3: they, all, are, ball, tall, when, what

In Term 4 we will not be learning any new sounds (GPC's) and will instead be focusing on applying all previously taught sounds to our reading and writing.

We will learn the following HRS words:

said, so, have, were, out, like, some, come, there, little, one, do, children, love

It would be very beneficial to ensure your children are confident recognising, recording and blending the sounds we have previously learnt. We highlight the sounds and HRS words your child knows following each termly assessment. Please speak to your class teacher if you have any questions or need any support with this.


Home – Human life cycles – how we grow and change over time

These books are matched directly to the current phonics learning and allows the children to practice their skills.
